Financial Support for Non-Profits and Schools responding to COVID-19 crisis

Arizona Community Foundation has established The Arizona COVID-19 Community Response Fund to support immediate and long-term needs associated with the outbreak of COVID-19 in our state. The fund provides immediate relief to nonprofit organizations in Arizona facing an increased demand for services from clients and communities as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak. Once the state of emergency has expired, any remaining funds will support nonprofit organizations impacted by COVID-19 financially as a result of program disruptions or cancellations resulting in revenue loss. To qualify:

1. You must be a 501 (c) 3 or school district.
2. You must serve Yavapai County only.
3. Your service/ program must be in response to the impact of COVID-19, and services needed.

Small Business Administration Disaster Loans:

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has approved an **Economic Injury Disaster Loan declaration for Arizona** that will help businesses impacted by COVID-19. Here are the details:

- These are working capital loans and funds may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll,

accounts payable, and other bills that could have been paid had the disaster not occurred. The loans may not be used to refinance existing loans, and are not intended to replace lost sales or profits or be used for business expansion.

- Individual businesses may be eligible for up to \$2 million through the program.
- Terms of the loan may be upwards of 15 to 30 years.
- The interest rate for a for-profit business is 3.75%.
- The interest rate for a non-profit organization is 2.75%.
- There is no cost to apply.
- The anticipated approval time is approximately three weeks.
